



### A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

### Greetings!!

The month of April has begun with a consistent weather forecast of rain showers, I'm already hopeful that the month of May will bring us a season of flowers that symbolize the beautiful neighborhoods blooming. Summer is right around the corner. Are you excited?

I remember growing up on the corner of 12th and Locust and summer in Milwaukee seemed like a collection of kids roller skating down the street, girls playing double dutch in the street (I never did quite learn how to jump), my cousin's playing a game of cans in front of the house, me begging my Aunt for some money to go to the corner store for some candy I didn't need and knowing every single neighbor on the block – who would probably tell me to hurry home before the street lights came on. Good times, good old days, fond memories.

Last month during an evening of community brainstorming, I spoke with several residents that reflected on those same "good old days" and all the things they loved about their community. A resident who lived in the Parklawn Neighborhood for 31 years told the room how she's welcomed every new homeowner to come after her and how she's enjoyed watching young families grow and build. And then we heard from two young teenage girls who sadly shared that they can't really relate to those "good old days" because right now they aren't always feeling safe and comfortable playing at their local neighborhood park when it's still light outside. They shared some scary incidents about violence, unfriendly adults and reckless driving making them anxious about what summer will bring. This reminds us that now more than ever our work remains necessary and essential. The work of pulling together and uniting residents to have some of these hard conversations about what isn't working, so that we can be

very strategic about what steps it will take to get back to days that felt good all the time.

# We are intentionally making strides to see the good...

That's why this month we are returning to our annual Collective Efficacy surveys. In the month of April and October we will host 1,000 front porch conversations across the city asking residents and youth to talk about their neighborhood as we learn if our efforts and organizing work has helped to build social cohesion (residents who know each other, trust each other and most importantly, residents willing to work together for the sake of safety). The more data that we can gather about how residents feel about being engaged and actively involved in the very blocks that they live in, the better we can be informed around how best to go deeper in our work or reimagine how to achieve our mission. So, if a Safe & Sounder is in our neighborhood, please indulge the team in a 5-minute conversation about your thoughts. We want to be effective, we want to be impactful, and we want to know that our efforts in Milwaukee are creating the change that we want to see.

While not every day in the neighborhood feels or looks beautiful, here at Safe & Sound – even on rainy and damp days – we are intentionally making strides to see the good and celebrate the wins of the YOU in community that's making a difference.

#### THE MISSION



Safe & Sound has been dedicated to improving public safety in high crime, low income Milwaukee neighborhoods since 1998. With a budget of approximately \$2.6 million and 29 staff members, we engage Milwaukee residents and youth in proactive neighborhood safety and revitalization efforts utilizing an award-winning, three-part approach which combines community organizing, youth development and partnerships with law enforcement. These activities aim to improve collective efficacy (social cohesion and informal social controls), which heavily influences the level of safety in communities. Safe & Sound is unique in the nation as a non-profit, civilian organization that utilizes research and evaluation to inform street level community engagement strategies

### **BLACK MALE YOUTH SUMMIT**

The UW-Milwaukee African American Male Initiative (AAMI) Summit on Black Male Youth-Milwaukee was established in 2012 by Black faculty and staff and community partners who saw a need to create positive experiences for black male youths at a higher education setting. The Summit, held on the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee's campus, has served as an opportunity for middle and high school black male students to learn from and engage with educators, administrators, parents/guardians and other stakeholders in Southeastern Wisconsin and Northern Illinois.

Safe & Sound, Inc Youth Organizers hosted a workshop called Don't be Thanos, be Spiderman: Understanding Your Strength and Power in Community. Helping youth to understand that the most powerful asset of a community is its PEOPLE. Giving examples of ways youth can be engaged in their community and why it is important. Safe & Sound, Inc Youth Organizers spoke about three ways to be Spiderman in their community:

- 1. Showing Up –Being present being consistent, helps with being a solution in your community.
- 2. Awareness Being conscious and aware of community trauma. Share your story with others and invite them to do the same.
- Youth Advocates –Being a Youth Advocate gives authority and ability to transform the thinking, attitudes, and behavior of others. It is amplifying the voice of youth.

### **COLLECTIVE IMPACT COLLABORATIVE MEETING**

The Collective Impact Collaborative meeting was an opportunity for residents and partners to meet another and engage in conversations around shared challenges impacting their neighborhoods. We recognize that these challenges are city wide and so it is important to connect our neighborhoods in strategizing on a city-wide solution.

Paul Schmidt, national Collective Impact thought leader, helped to facilitate the conversation and walk attendees through the basics of collective impact, the need for collective leadership, what collective leadership looks like and urged residents to plug in and be that leader. Nearly 70 residents, youth, and partners were in attendance.
