

Community Organizer

We are currently hiring two community organizers. One team is in need of a bilingual organizer who speaks Spanish.

The Community Organizer at Safe & Sound is one part of a three-part strategy aimed at building collective efficacy in neighborhoods to create safer communities. Our community organizers meet residents on their front porches and at community meetings, rebuilding social networks and facilitating connections to resources to make neighborhoods safer

and stronger. Community organizers work with residents to amplify their voices by helping to implement strategies of crime prevention. A critical part of the organizing function is to build community-police relationships by serving as a liaison between residents and law enforcement providing two-way communication (prioritizing and advocating for neighborhood safety priorities within the district). Community Organizers need to operate successfully when working independently and as a member of the team.

Youth Organizer

The Youth Organizer at Safe & Sound is one part of a three-part strategy aimed at building collective efficacy in neighborhoods to create safer communities. The Youth Organizer focuses on engaging youth in positive activities in the community, providing project-based opportunities for creativity and leadership development. Youth Organizers work with youth to amplify their voices by helping to implement strategies of crime prevention. A critical part of the organizing function is to build community-police relationships by serving as a liaison between youth and law enforcement providing two-way communication (prioritizing and advocating for neighborhood safety priorities within the district). Youth Organizers need to operate successfully when working independently and as a member of the team.

Neighborhood Safety Coordinator

The Neighborhood Safety Coordinator (NSC) serves as a liaison between City of Milwaukee residents living in the assigned Milwaukee Police Department (MPD) districts and various law-enforcement, other government agencies, and the Assistant District Attorneys serving as Community Partners in these neighborhoods. The NSC works with Safe & Sound staff, the Community Partners, the MPD and community-based organizations planning and coordinating community forums, landlord meetings, block watch meetings and community collaborations that orient residents, families and businesses on the nuisance abatement process. The NSC also provides resources and advocacy to encourage crime prevention, gang prevention and crime awareness. The NSC is tasked with information gathering, organization and reporting leading to the abatement of Community Partnership Unit (CPU) reported nuisances that arise in and around properties located within the assigned Milwaukee Police District.
